ROBBY LONG

DePauw Interim Head Coach

Robby Long enters his first season as interim head coach and sixth overall on the DePauw football staff. Long has served as an assistant coach each of the last five years and as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator each of the last three. He also serves as DePauw's coordinator of student athletic recruitment.

Under his direction, the Tiger defense ranked 26th in NCAA Division III in interceptions in 2007, 30th in sacks per game and 47th in rushing defense, while the 2006 squad was 31st in sacks and 40th in both interceptions and pass efficiency defense rating.

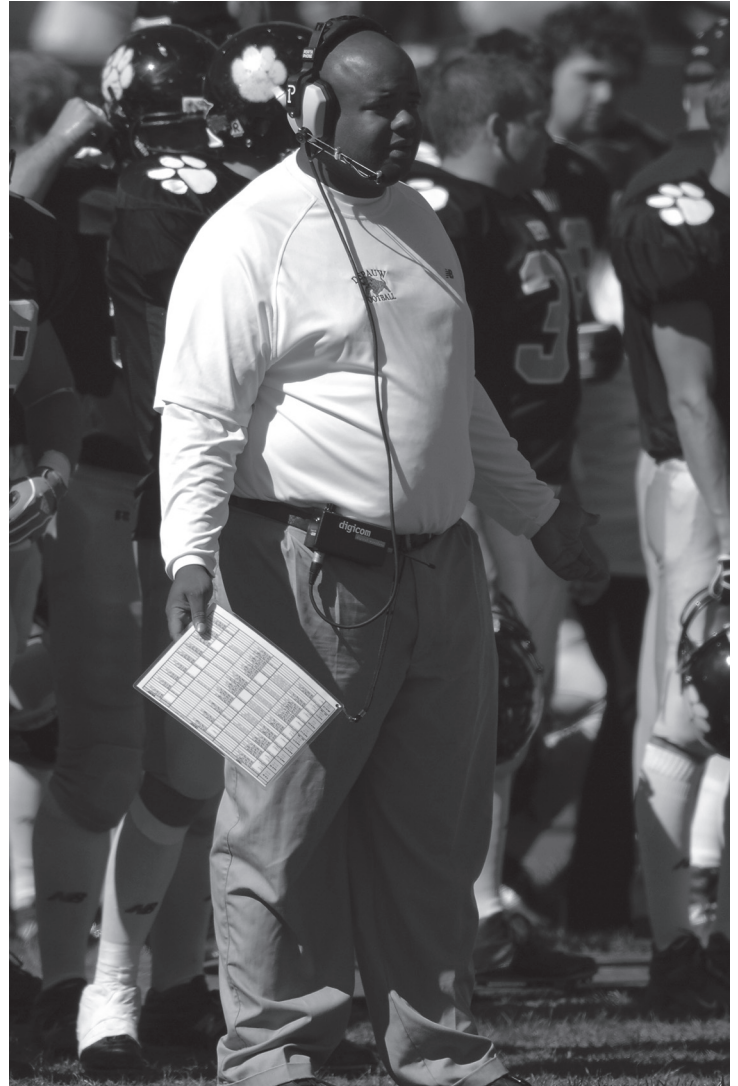
In the two seasons prior to coming to DePauw, Long served as a graduate assistant on the defensive line at the University of Illinois. He assisted the defensive line coach in planning and conducting practices in addition to organizing and coaching the defensive and special teams scout teams.

Long, a native of Champaign, Ill., earned a bachelor of science of applied life degree from Illinois.

A three-year varsity letterman for the Fighting Illini, Long played on the 2001 outright Big Ten champion squad that finished with a 10-2 record and competed in the 2002 Sugar Bowl. He also played on the squad that won the 1999 Micron PC Bowl and finished with an 8-4 record. Long was the team's defensive player of the week after the California game in 2001.

In the summer of 2006, Long served as an assistant coach with the Chicago Bears as part of the National Football League's Minority Coaching Fellowship Program.

Long and his wife, Stacy, reside in suburban Indianapolis.

Assistant Coaches



LEN FELTON
Linebackers

Len Felton enters his fourth season as an assistant coach at DePauw and will coach the linebackers. He also serves as the athletic department's special projects coordinator.

Felton earned a bachelor of science degree in English from the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse in 1988 and came to DePauw from Cornell College in Mt. Vernon, Iowa, where he was the defensive backs coach for two seasons.

He previously served one year each as an assistant at both St. Norbert College and Lawrence University and was the head coach at St. Thomas More School as well as an assistant in the Village of Allouez School, both in Green Bay. Felton also was a sports reporter for WLUK-TV in Green Bay for 14 years.



TIM HREHA
Defensive Linemen

Tim Hreha (RAY-ha), now in his 32nd year as assistant football coach at DePauw, serves as defensive line coach. He also is an assistant track and field coach at DePauw.

Throughout the years, the Tigers' defense has been ranked among the nation's leaders. The Tigers led the Indiana Collegiate Athletic Conference in rushing, total and scoring defense in 1995. The 1983 Tigers led all of Division III in rushing defense by allowing just 41.6 yards on the ground.

Hreha was a three-year letterman in football for DePauw and co-captain during his senior year. A three-year starter at defensive tackle, Hreha earned the team's spirit award as a junior.

After graduating in 1973 with a B.A. degree in history, he earned the M.A.T. degree in physical education in 1976 while serving as graduate assistant football coach. Hreha has also served as head men's and women's track and field coach at DePauw and coached Alan Hill to a national pole vault championship as well as two additional all-America awards.



BOBBY JACKSON
Defensive Backs

Bobby Jackson begins his fourth season as an assistant for the Tigers and will coach the defensive backs. Jackson also serves as special teams coordinator and is an assistant track and field coach.

Jackson graduated from the University of Illinois in 2001 with a bachelor's degree in economics with a minor in history and was a four-year starting safety for the Illini. An all-Big Ten selection in 2001, Jackson served as team captain twice including his senior season when Illinois was the outright Big Ten champion and played in the 2002 Sugar Bowl.

He played professionally with NFL Europe's Scottish Claymore in 2003 where he was the team's special team's captain. Jackson was also on the NFL rosters of the New York Jets, Indianapolis Colts and Green Bay Packers. Most recently, he was an assistant coach at Champaign Central High School in Illinois.

Jackson, his wife Chequetta and son Devon (5) reside in suburban Indianapolis.



JAMES MUNGRO
Running Backs

James Mungro enters his first season as a part-time assistant and will coach the running backs after playing for the Indianapolis Colts from 2002-06.

A member of Indianapolis' 2006 Super Bowl champion squad. Mungro rushed for 336 yards and eight touchdowns in his rookie campaign including a 114-yard effort against the Philadelphia Eagles in his first NFL start. In 2004, he caught Peyton Manning's NFL record-tying 48th touchdown pass against San Diego.

Mungro earned a bachelor of science degree from Syracuse University and majored in selective education. While at Syracuse, he rushed for 2,869 career yards with 29 rushing touchdowns including 1,170 yards and 14 scores as a senior. In 2001, he earned Insight.com Bowl MVP honors against Kansas State and did the same in the 1999 Music City Bowl against Kentucky.

Mungro was a *Parade* and *Street and Smith's* high school all-America selection at East Stroudsburg (Pa.) High School where he also was the Pennsylvania Player of the Year as a junior and an all-state selection in each of his final two seasons. He set 48 team records during his high school career and rushed for 8,432 career yards including 2,541 as a senior.

He serves as chair of the Scholarship/Development Committee for the Rhodes to Success Foundation and founded the James Mungro Scholarship

Fund in 2002. Most recently he was the head coach of the Indiana Warriors semi-pro team of the North American Football League.



DUSTIN WARD
Offensive Coordinator
Quarterbacks

Dustin Ward enters his third season as the Tigers' offensive coordinator after previously serving as the running backs coach during the 2004 season.

Under his direction, the 2008 Tigers finished the season ranked 16th in NCAA Division III in both passing yards per game and passing efficiency rating, 42nd in scoring offense and 47th in total offense. In 2007, DePauw ranked 36th in total offense.

Ward came from St. Joseph's (Ind.) College where he was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach during the 2006 season. He also worked as a recruiting assistant at Indiana University in 2005.

A 2003 University of Illinois graduate, Ward earned a bachelor of science degree in leisure studies/sports management.

The Champaign, Ill., native played 22 games at quarterback and started nine during his Illini career. He completed just over 54 percent of his career passes for nearly 2,000 yards and 13 touchdowns.

In his first season as quarterback in 2000, he earned a start in the Illini's season finale against Northwestern and completed 20 of 37 passes for 246 yards which were all career highs.



JAKE WISSING
Offensive Linemen

Jake Wissing begins his third season as an assistant coach at his alma mater and will direct the offensive line. Wissing came to DePauw from St. Joseph's (Ind.) College where he coached the offensive line

during the 2006 season.

Wissing graduated from DePauw in 2003 and earned a bachelor of arts degree while majoring in communication. While at DePauw, Wissing served as a student assistant his senior year after playing for the Tigers each of his first three seasons. He was named to the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference Academic Honor Roll in 2000.

Upon graduation he served as a graduate assistant coach at Alfred University where he coached the running backs and earned a master of professional studies degree.

He then moved on to Norwich University where he coached the running backs during the 2005 season.



BRIAN W. CASEY President

Brian W. Casey was born and raised in New Jersey. As an undergraduate at the University of Notre Dame, he earned a B.A. in philosophy and economics, was elected to

Phi Beta Kappa, and graduated summa cum laude, receiving the Economics Award for his class. Casey was also captain of Notre Dame's varsity swim team and was the University's "Scholar-Athlete of the Year" in 1985.

He went on to earn his J.D. from Stanford University Law School in 1988, graduating with honors. He was a member and article editor of the Stanford Law Review.

After pursuing a career in law, he earned his Ph.D. in the history of American civilization from Harvard University. His field of specialization was the history of American higher education and American intellectual history. Dr. Casey's dissertation examined "Nostalgia and the Campus: Emotion and American Higher Education, 1880-1940."

As Assistant Provost at Brown University, he was charged with academic planning across the arts and sciences. He spearheaded an initiative to introduce students to a multidisciplinary approach to the study of commerce and entrepreneurship, and to support faculty research in commerce, organizations, and entrepreneurship. He was also a key figure in efforts to develop academic programs with Brown's institutional neighbor, the Rhode Island School of Design. He also helped to develop a multidepartmental program that brought faculty, students, and visiting fellows together who were involved in the study of America's past via an international seminar that highlighted and strengthened faculty work across Brown's departments of history, English, American civilization, anthropology, Africana studies, and the Center for the Study of Race and Ethnicity in America.

As Associate Dean for Academic Affairs at Harvard University, he had responsibility for faculty appointments, recruitment and development, as well as strategic academic planning across the Faculty of Arts and Sciences. In 2008, he accepted the office of the President at DePauw University.



PAGE COTTON Director of Athletics

Page Cotton enters his 14th year as the Theodore M. Katula Director of Athletics. Cotton also oversees recreational sports at DePauw.

Cotton oversees the University's 21 men's and women's athletic teams as well as several club and intramural programs. During his tenure as director of athletics, DePauw's athletic program has consistently performed well in the

Directors' Cup standings. The Tigers finished 13th in 2005-06, 15th in 2007 and 18th in 2008.

Additionally, DePauw has played host to several NCAA regional tournaments as well as national championships in men's tennis and men's and women's indoor track and field.

A professor of kinesiology at DePauw, Cotton received the Medora C. Adams Distinguished Professor Award in April, 2004.

He also served as the men's soccer coach for 39 seasons and compiled a 390-190-33 record including .500 or better seasons in each of his final 26 seasons.

Additional success for Cotton's Tigers came on the national level with eight appearances in the NCAA Division III Championship with the most recent trip coming in 2000 when the Tigers advanced to the second round. In Indiana Collegiate Athletic Conference play from 1989 through 1997, the Tigers dominated the competition by winning all 54 matches. Cotton earned the league's coach of the year honors each of those nine seasons.

A native of Newton, Mass., Cotton graduated from Springfield College in 1969 where he captained the team that posted an undefeated season and captured Atlantic Coast and New England championships.

Cotton was inducted into the Indiana Soccer Hall of Fame in 2003 and recently chaired the NCAA Soccer Championships committee. Currently, he serves on the NCAA Division III Membership Committee as well as the National Business Travel Association's Sports Travel Task Force.

He and his wife, Narda, are the parents of Elizabeth and Page.



REX CALL Director of Sports Medicine

Rex Call enters his 24th year at DePauw. With a staff of three certified athletic trainer, Call administers sports health care services to over 400 men's and women's intercollegiate student-athletes at DePauw. He works directly with football, men's basketball and softball.

On the academic side, Call is a faculty member with rank of Associate Professor in Kinesiology. He teaches in the Athletic Training Education Program, provides clinical instruction for athletic training students and is an academic advisor. In a five-year process that culminated in May 1999, he led the Athletic Training Education Program to accreditation by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs.

Over the years, Call has been active in both his profession and community. In May, he was awarded the 2002 College/University Athletic Trainer of the Year by the Indiana Athletic Trainers Association.

Call is an oral examiner for the National Athletic Trainer's Association Board of Certification. He has assisted six high schools in the first-time utiliza-

tion of a certified athletic trainer to care for their athletes. Each spring, Call and the DePauw athletic training staff assist Orthopaedics Indianapolis and Greencastle Physical Therapy & Sports Medicine in providing affordable and comprehensive sports physicals for Putnam County school-age athletes. He has been active with Main Street Greencastle and worked with the Heritage Preservation Society in the development of the "Heritage Wall."

Call earned a B.S. degree from Ball State University in 1979 and an M.S. degree from the University of Arizona in 1980. In addition to DePauw, Call worked four years with the University of Pittsburgh football program and worked two preseason training camps with the Buffalo Bills. He and his wife, Carol, have three children.



BILL WAGNER Director of Sports Information

Bill Wagner begins his 24th year as director of sports information. The Tiffin, Ohio, native is responsible for publicity for all 21 of the University's intercollegiate athletic programs and oversees the athletics portion

of the DePauw Web site.

Wagner earned a bachelor of science in business administration with a major in marketing and an emphasis on advertising and marketing research from Miami University in 1985 before obtaining a master of arts in sport management from The Ohio State University in 1986. He worked in the sports information offices at both schools.

He served as a venue media director at the Tenth Pan American Games in Indianapolis in 1987 and assisted with media relations at the 1988 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Midwest Regional at the Pontiac Silverdome. Wagner also worked in sales for the Cleveland Cavaliers professional basketball team.

A member of the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA), Wagner recently served a three-year term on the national organization's board of directors and is currently the president of Division III sports information directors. He also is a district coordinator for the *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-America program.

Wagner received a "Best in the Nation" award for the 1996 and 1997 football media guides and for the cover of the 1988 football media guide. The 2002 and 1994 guides earned second place honors.

In all, 10 of the DePauw football guides since 1992 have been ranked among the top five in the nation as well as three men's basketball guides.

Wagner has previously been a member of the Football Writers Association of America, the United States Basketball Writers of America and the Collegiate Baseball Writers of America.

He and his wife, Shelly, reside in Greencastle.
